INTERNATIONAL BUDDY PROGRAM

International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS) hosts the International Buddy Program which pairs incoming international students with a current Catholic U student, their buddy. The buddy assists with a variety of tasks, including finding classroom locations, learning to ride the metro, and spends time making them comfortable in their new surroundings. TAKE FLIGHT

The Take Flight program, supports the transition of first generation students to life at Catholic University, capitalizing on the gifts and talents they possess. During the First Year Program, incoming first generation students are paired with a peer mentor, who guides them through their transition to college and shares their insights and wisdom for assimilating to the Catholic U community. They are also able to participate in a series of community building activities and socials throughout the academic year. Following their freshman year and through their senior year, the Take Flight program offers continued support and mentorship to first generation students. This is done through skill building sessions community building activities, as well as giving students the opportunity to become a peer mentor to the next group of incoming students. PATHWAYS TO COLLEGE

Pathways to College is a mentorship program that calls on university students to rise up to the challenge and help create pathways for students of color (primarily Black and Hispanic) to reach their post-secondary academic and career goals. PEERS

PEERS is Catholic University's only peer education group that educates students on alcohol and other drug use and abuse, mental health awareness, sexual assault and violence education, healthy relationships, and bystander intervention. PEERS is composed of undergraduate students who educate and mentor students through various situations and coordinate a variety of events and educational programming for the Catholic University community. PEERS goal is to create a safe and open dialogue about how they can raise awareness for the above issues and shift the culture on our campus.

MAJOR MENTORS

The major mentor program helps first-year business students feel engaged, supported, and welcomed. Small groups of incoming students are paired with a upperclassmen mentors based on their major or interests and have the opportunity to learn from a role model, resource, and friend as they navigate their first year at Catholic University. The Major Mentor Program creates a welcoming and engaging experience for first year students through weekly meetings and monthly activities and events, which promote community development and networking.
